



# STARGAZING IN THE WINTER

**FIND A DARK, OPEN SPACE ON A CLOUDLESS NIGHT AND  
SEARCH FOR THESE 5 WINTER CONSTELLATIONS!**

As the Earth Orbits, constellations change direction and location in the sky! Keep this in mind as you stargaze.

## ORION

This bright constellation is named after a famous hunter from Greek mythology. It resembles Orion himself holding a bow, ready to fire!



## PERSEUS

This constellation is named for the famous Greek demigod, Perseus.

## CANIS MAJOR

Meaning "the greater dog" in Latin, Canis Major is the largest of two dog shaped constellations which follows Orion, "the hunter" through the night sky.

## ← TAURUS

Latin for "the bull," Taurus is one of the 13 Zodiac constellations. The bull's horns can be clearly seen among the stars.

## ← GEMINI

Another Zodiac constellation, Gemini represents a pair of twins holding hands in the sky!

## ← CETUS

In Greek mythology, Cetus was a huge sea monster who was slayed by the hero, Perseus.

## ← URSA MINOR & URSA MAJOR

Commonly known as the little and big dipper, Ursa Major and Ursa Minor can be seen all year round in NB.
