Endangered species? No.

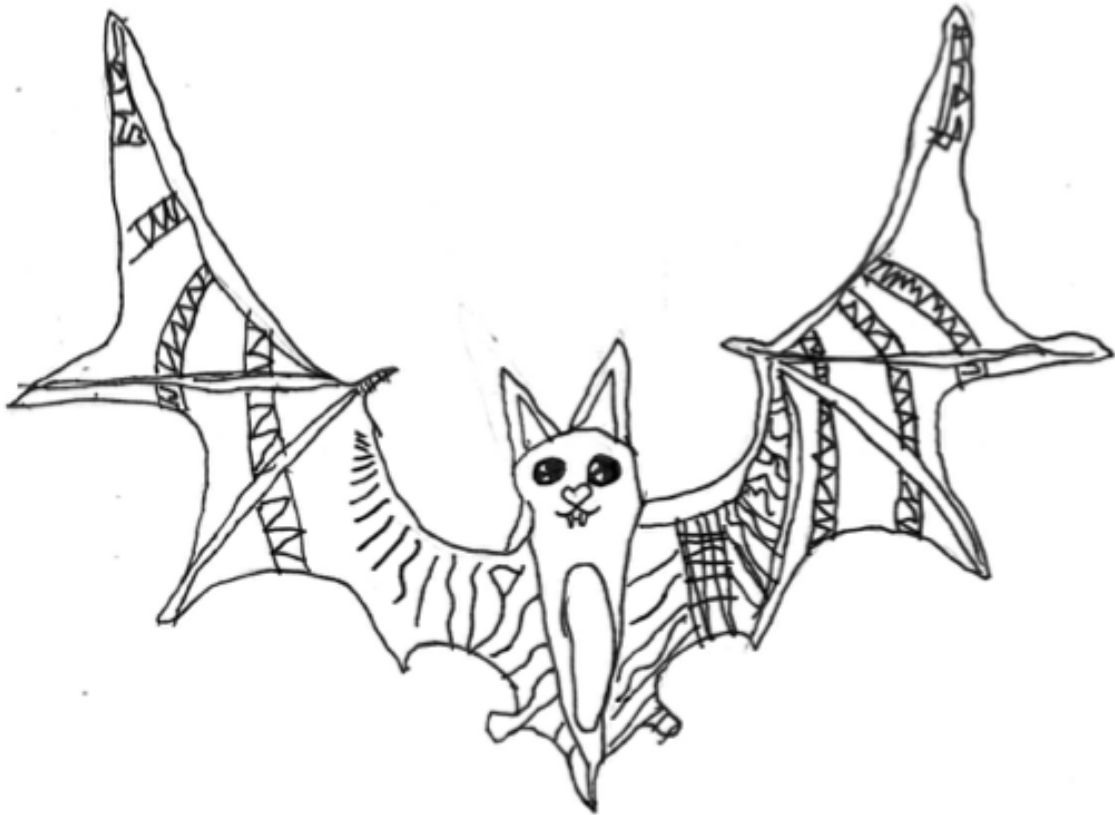
Habitat: Tree hollows, holes in the ground or logs.
