VOLUNTEER

LIFESTYLE CHANGES

Small changes in your daily life to help the environment, such as practicing the 5 steps to Watch Your Paws when outdoors, walking more to cut back on energy consumption or reducing the amount of new goods you buy (so resources don't have need to be mined or industrially harvested to make more stuff). These may seem like small steps, but are important to shift our society to be more nature and climate friendly. Actions you take personally help normalize new behaviours for your friends, family and neighbours. They can also be done alongside advocating for systems change.
